

FAQ- LAUNCH Medicine and Healthcare CNA

1. Who can access CNA training?

- The training is open to students in grades 11 or 12.
- The training is available to students onsite who are in the LAUNCH Medicine and Healthcare Strand.
- The training is available to students who submitted a request for the course through the Start College Now process.
- Students who are not in LAUNCH Medicine and Healthcare who requested the course can still apply to WCTC and take the course offsite at WCTC. Applications for this process are due in Oct and March.

2. Where is the training?

- The CNA course will be taught in the new healthcare and bioscience lab being constructed in the summer of 2019 at Brookfield East High School.
- Students will also be traveling to clinic locations for experiences within the course.

3. What does the training include?

- 120 hours of classroom and lab experience.
- 32 hours of clinicals in a long-term care facility.
- Supplies, books, scrubs, criminal background check, TB test, drug screen and Wisconsin State exam.

4. Who is providing the training?

- Elmbrook Schools will provide the cost for the program and Paramount 360 will provide the training and testing for the state exam.
